ularly desirous of
having Democrats on
the call, as I believe
that this administra-
tion and the new Con-
gress will do more
than has been done

in twenty years by the
Republicans - I mean
in settling the "Mormon
problem" which is no
problem at all - I treat
of Mormonism as a
political machine of
organized treason.
Judge Field of the Supreme
Court says my argu-
ment is sound.
